Note: The EMA program is designed for non-traditional students who are currently working in emergency management. A secondary admission process is required for this program. All applicants must possess an associate degree and have a BAAS Block of technical/vocational credits (up to a maximum of 36 hours) that will be converted to academic hours prior to admission. NOTE II: At least 36 hours of advanced work (3000- or 4000-level courses) for which tuition is paid must be earned at WTAMU. A maximum of six semester hours in religion (RELI) and six semester hours in physical education (PHED) courses can count toward a baccalaureate degree.

NOTE: This is NOT a degree plan. All undergraduate students must request an official degree plan from their academic dean's office by the time they have completed 30 credit hours.
